- 1. Call to order and approval of minutes from previous meeting.
 - \circ $\,$ Meeting called to order 3:02 pm $\,$
 - o Minutes approved unanimously

JP proposes that we reverse the order of agenda items 2 and 3, all agree. The subsequent minutes show the new order of agenda items.

- 2. Procedure for reviewing unit OPS budget requests.
 - Presentation of a proposed procedure by chair (JP)
 - Stage 1 identify targeted reductions ("low hanging fruit")
 - Stage 2 establish a formula and tiers for % reduction
 - First step is trying identify uses of OPS funding that are not clearly in line with the primary goal of supporting undergrad education (directly) – but it is usefully pointed out that "delivering student SCH and advancing graduate education, are significantly more impactful...".
 - Discussion on specific questions regarding OPS requests:
 - \circ $\;$ Federal work study undergrads are a bargain, okay to allow in departments.
 - Example: History needs front desk coverage as it has only one staff person. Also possible that some can use UF student assistants for grading – such as writing center.
 - Economics receives no OPS, has their own budget
 - Humanities does not receive OPS
 - Review of implications of loss of DL fees: The loss of these fees has greatly impacted certain departments that were proactive in developing online majors, and which also allowed (until recently) residential students to take online courses too. A major point is that this was part of a larger effort by UF Online to expand online majors online. This requires courses in all of the courses required for a major plus a few electives. The online majors have not turned out to be large enrollers.
 - Question concerning Adjuncts
 - They don't count as students or faculty; should OPS requests for adjuncts factor into our decision? Some departments may differ on why they hire adjuncts, e.g., LLC
 - \circ $\;$ Chris McCarty reminds us that the OPS funds primary functions are:
 - Undergraduate mission
 - Fund graduate students

- Chair recommends going ahead with stage 1 reviews of OPS requests, 2 member teams reviewing a set of budget requests
- 3. Finalization of request for additional information from the College.
 - Proposal: include degree production/completion rates for a department as a criterion (then we need this data to be requested of CLAS)
 - CLAS will look into total requests for OPS so that we have the total amount requested, and can then figure out what we need to cut to get to 17M
 - o Chris McCarty will try to respond to our requests as best as possible
- 4. AOB --Additional Context and Discussion
 - This process may not be feasible to complete by December although still a worthy goal.
 - Departments will still have choices about how to allocate the amount of funding that they receive. Committee may recommend some reductions, department still gets to choose actual allocations.
 - Committee assignment for next meeting: review unit OPS budget requests in groups. We don't need to be draconian in our suggestions, but we should look for obvious outliers
 - E.g., outlier of # of RAships
 - o John Palmer will send follow-up message with group assignments
